By participating in you commit to...





... collaborating in teams

You will be part of a multidisciplinary team (all fields are welcome!), made up of 2 to 4 members. Together, you'll work to address a real-world challenge presented by a company in the agri-food sector. Effective communication, task-sharing, and leveraging each team member's expertise will be key to your success.

... dedicate 180 hours to it (per team) 🌈

You and your team will need to log around 180 hours of work on the project, which will take place over one term. This work will be done alongside your studies, so be sure to get approval from your professors and supervisors before committing.





... sign a non-disclosure agreement

Some companies will share confidential information, such as details about their processes, to help you tackle their challenges. To protect this information, you may be asked to sign a non-disclosure agreement (NDA), which will restrict its use to the context of 'Ça Relève!'.

... take part in meetings

You will be required to attend at least two in-person meetings (an initial meeting and a presentation to the Innovation Support Service (SSI) team), as well as three meetings with the company (either in-person or virtual, depending on the circumstances): an initial meeting to define the work plan, a mid-project meeting, and a final meeting. You and your team will also need to organize internal meetings to advance your project. It is essential that you commit to being present and actively participating in each meeting.



... visit the company

Whenever possible, a company visit will be organized to give you and your team a better understanding of its operations and challenges.

... submit the following deliverables

Your team will need to provide the company with a detailed work plan outlining the objectives and expected deliverables, to be validated at the start of the project. At the end, a final report (maximum 15 pages) must be submitted, containing the research findings and your recommendations or proposed solutions. You will receive support from the 'Ça Relève!' team for any questions, as well as from an expert mentor who will review the final report to ensure its scientific content is accurate before it's submitted to the company. Additionally, you will need to create an infographic summarizing your project for the BÉNÉFIQ2025 event (November 5-6, 2025).





... receive a scholarship

At the end of the project, you will receive a scholarship of up to 1000\$ for the work completed, along with a certificate of participation. This is probably the most rewarding commitment, isn't it?
